

Privacy Policy

This privacy policy sets out what data we collect from visitors to our site. We take the privacy of all visitors to our site very seriously. Any data collected is stored according to our Data Protection Policy which explains the security measures we use to protect personal data. The Data Protection Policy is available on request.

Visitors can use the information published on our website, as long as this is referenced appropriately. We do not accept any liability that may arise from using or downloading information from this website.

Our use of data is governed by the Data Protection Act 1998, and the General Data Protection Regulation, 2018.

Information we collect

If you submit information through our contact form, such as your name, email address and website, we may use this information to contact you in response to your message. We may store this information in order to contact you in future. In line with our Data Protection Policy, we will not store any data for longer than six months.

Our website is provided by WordPress.com, a service which is provided by the company Automattic. Wordpress.com uses cookies for its 'Site Stats' feature, which counts the number of visitors to a site and the number from specific locations. We use the site stats feature to help us understand our website traffic and usage.

Information collected by WordPress.com

Automattic collects information about visitors to WordPress.com sites. This includes information that a visitor provides to a site, such as data entered into a contact form submission. Automattic also collects some information about visitors automatically. The following information is taken directly from Automattic's privacy policy, and concerns the information that Automattic collects automatically from their websites:

- **Technical Data from a Visitor's Computer and Etcetera:** We collect the information that web browsers, mobile devices, and servers typically make available about visitors to a Site, such as the IP address, browser type, unique device identifiers, language preference, referring site, the date and time of access, operating system, and mobile network information.
- **Location Information:** We may determine the approximate location of a visitor's device from the IP address. We collect and use this information to, for example, tally for our Users how many people visit their Sites from certain geographic regions.
- **Information from Cookies and Other Technologies:** A cookie is a string of information that a Site stores on a visitor's computer, and that the visitor's browser provides to the Site each time the

visitor returns. Pixel tags (also called web beacons) are small blocks of code placed on Sites. Automattic uses cookies and other technologies like pixel tags to help identify and track visitors and Site usage.
